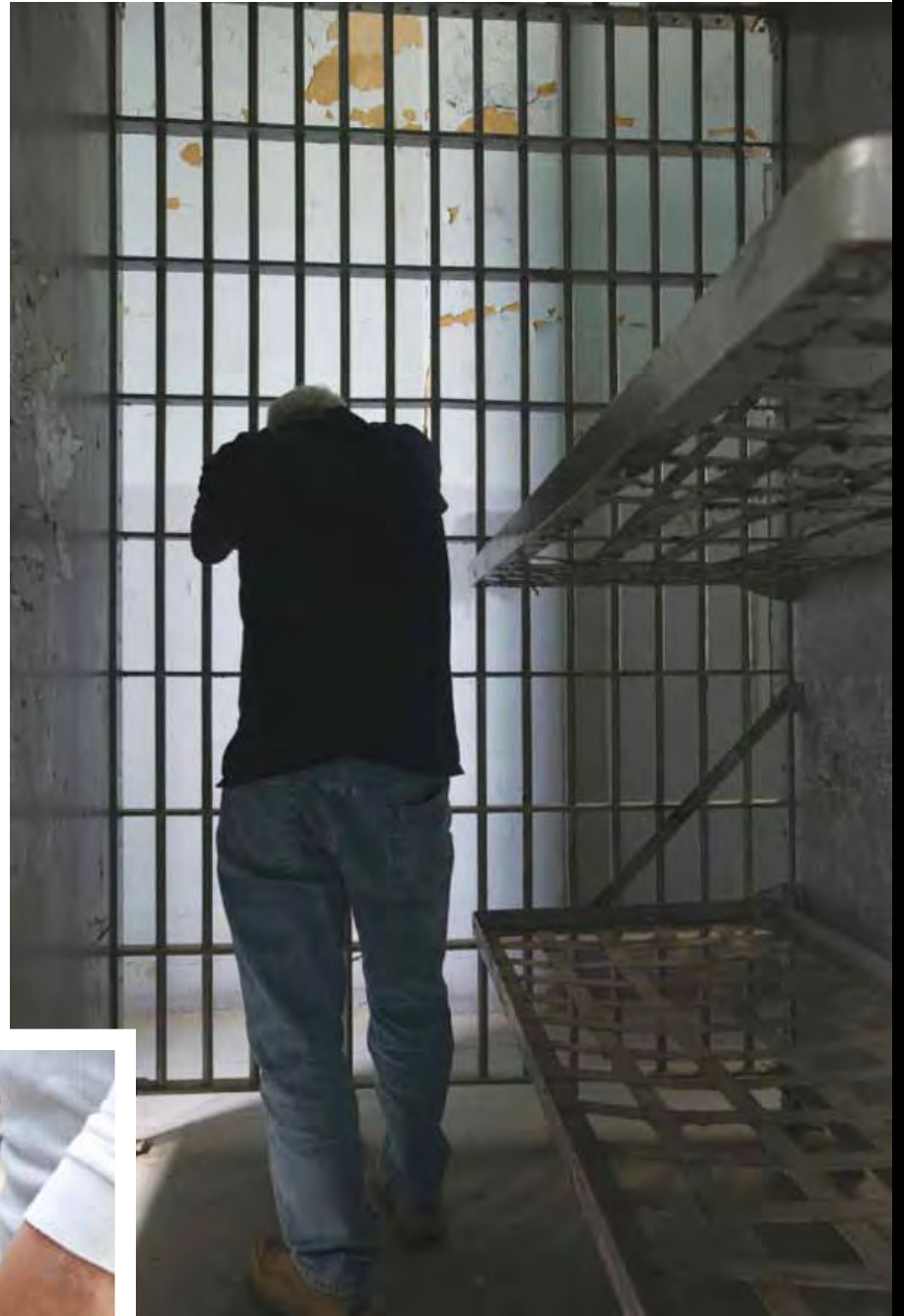


CORRECTIONS
