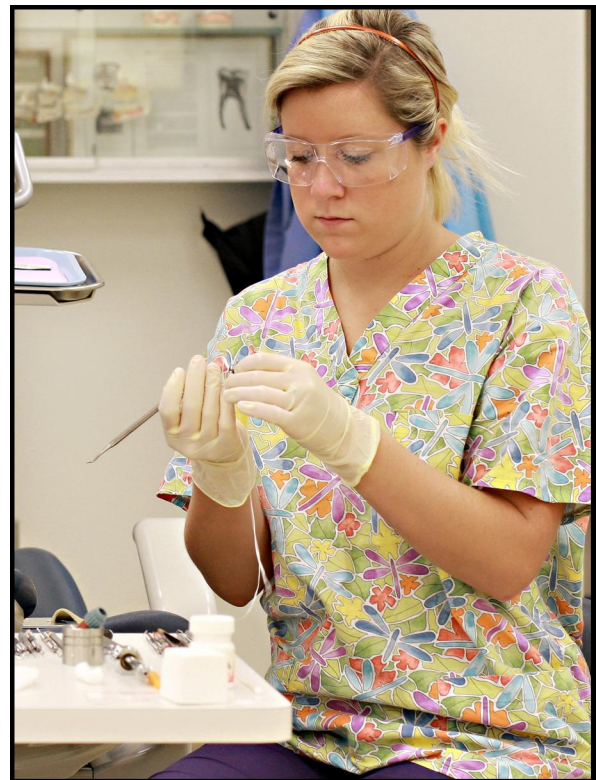
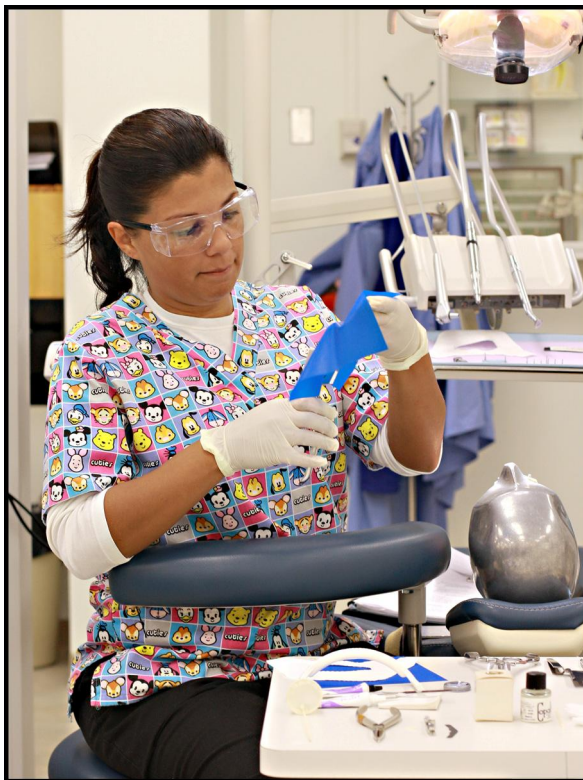

The Coastal Carolina Community College Dental Assisting program is one of 256 programs accredited by the Commission on Dental Accreditation of the American Dental Association.

It takes one year to complete the Dental Assisting program.

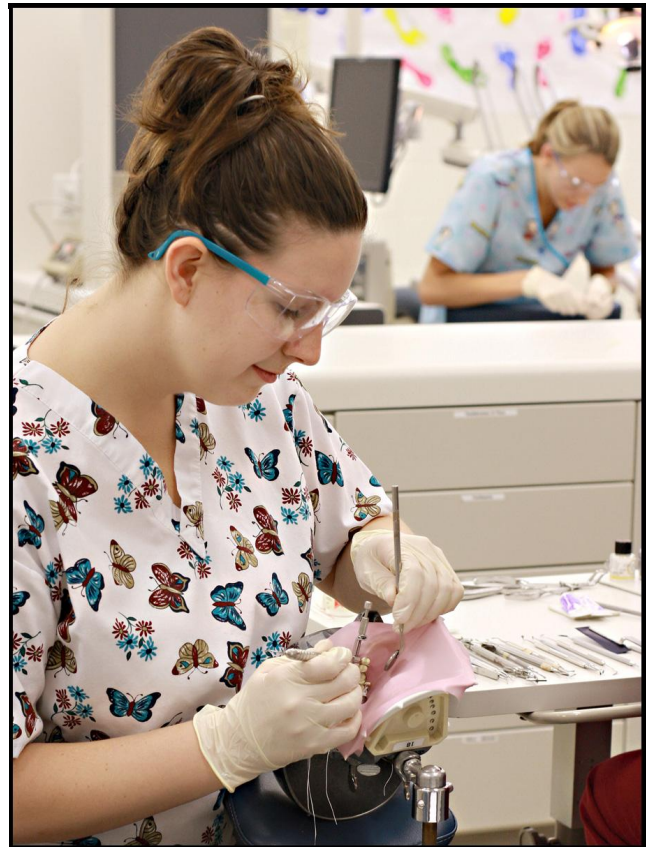
Dental assistants take courses in basic sciences, dental sciences, general education and dental assisting science.

Graduates receive a Diploma in Dental Assisting which qualifies them as a Dental Assistant II in North Carolina.

Graduates are eligible to take the Dental Assisting National Board to become Certified Dental Assistants. Coastal graduates consistently score above the national average on all components of the Dental Assisting National Board!

What does a dental assistant do?

- Assists the dentist during a variety of treatment procedures
- Takes and develops x-rays
- Serves as infection control officer
- Helps patients feel comfortable before, during and after treatment
- Teaches patients appropriate oral hygiene strategies
- Performs office management tasks
- Helps provide direct patient care in general dentistry and the dental specialties
